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### INTRODUCTION

The U.S Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is issuing this update to inform the community and local officials of a major phase of construction to be undertaken in and around the Price Landfill Site (Site) in the City of Pleasantville and Egg Harbor Township, New Jersey. The construction work is being performed with \$16.3 million in American Reinvestment & Recovery Act (ARRA) funding for the clean-up of contaminated groundwater.

### FORCE MAIN CONSTRUCTION

In late December/early January, force main construction will begin. The force main (i.e. the underground pipeline carrying treated groundwater) will be constructed of 6-inch diameter high density polyethylene pipe and will run approximately 4,700 linear feet. The force main will exit the groundwater treatment facility to be constructed on the east side of Saw Mill Road across from the landfill and travel north on Saw Mill Road, turn west on California Avenue (County Route 663), turn north onto Mill Road (County Route 651), turn west on Pleasant Avenue and terminate at the Pleasant Avenue Pumping Station (PAPS). Once reaching the PAPS, the force main will connect to a manhole and treated groundwater will mix with municipal sanitary sewerage and be conveyed to the Atlantic County Utilities Authority Wastewater Treatment Facility.

### COMMUNITY IMPACTS

During force main construction, there will be temporary disruption to normal traffic patterns. A traffic control plan has been developed and approved by Atlantic County as well as the three municipalities (City of Pleasantville, City of Absecon and Egg Harbor Township) that will be affected during force main construction. Measures will be taken to minimize traffic disruption.

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## CHANGES TO TRAFFIC PATTERNS

Message boards will be placed at the following intersections two weeks prior to the beginning of construction to notify local motorists of the pending construction work:

- Delilah Road and Fire Road
- California Avenue and Route 9
- Mill Road and Westcoat Road

Saw Mill Road will be closed to all but local traffic between Delilah Road and California Avenue. The closures will occur during the day from approximately January 3 – 21, 2011. Traffic will be detoured to Fire Road. The southbound lane will be closed on Mill Road from approximately January 31 – February 11, 2011. Motorists should expect stops due to the construction activity and delays as traffic is detoured to the northbound lane.

The westbound lane will be closed on California Avenue from approximately January 24 – 28, 2011. Motorists should expect stops due to construction activity and delays as traffic is detoured to the eastbound lane. The westbound lane will be closed on Pleasant Avenue from approximately January 31 – February 11, 2011. Motorists should expect stops due to construction activity and delays as traffic is detoured to the eastbound lane.

Access to driveways for local traffic will be maintained during road and lane closures to the degree possible and driveway closures will be coordinated with residents.
